		<b>Red</b>
		<b>Ultra Girl hybrid</b>
		7-9 oz firm red fruit with good flavor. 62 days. Early staking Semi determinate with good tolerance to cracking
		<b>Dester</b>
		Winner of SSE's 2011 Tomato Tasting and runner-up in 2012. Pink beefsteak tomatoes grow up to 1 pound. Excellent flavor. Indeterminate. Fruit ripens throughout the season. 70-80 days
		<b>German Pink</b>
		Potato leaf plants produce large 1-2 pound beefsteak fruits. Meaty flesh with few seeds, very little cracking or blossom scars. Full sweet flavor. Excellent for canning, freezing, and slicing. Indeterminate, 85 days from transplant.
		<b>Speckled Siberian</b>
		Short, bushy, Russian heirloom good for cooler growing regions to produce 2-inch red, round, slightly flattened tomatoes with light speckles on skin. Good taste. A good choice for a salad tomato. 78 days, determinate.
		<b>Oregon Spring</b>
		Early, 6 oz. fruit, mild sweet flavor. Compact plants are determinate.

		<b>Yellow</b>
		<b>Jaune Flamme</b>
		4 oz. delicious, mid season, silver dollar size, Martha Stewart's favorite tomato. A blend of sweet and tart. Midseason. Indeterminate.
		<b>Moonglow</b>
		Indeterminate, regular-leaf tomato plants that produce heavy yields of beautiful, 6-8 oz., 2", globes. A brilliant, warm-orange slicer with great texture and flavor. (Winner of Seed Saver's Exchange 2007 Heirloom Tomato Tasting .)
		<b>Green</b>
		<b>Green Zebra</b>
		Famous 2" tomato ripens to a yellow-gold with green zebra-like stripes. The flesh is lime-emerald in color. Delicious! Indeterminant.
		<b>Malakhite Box</b>
		Large, delicious, beautiful. A very nice slicer and good compact tomato for growing in a small garden or container. Midseason Indeterminate.
		<b>Striped</b>
		<b>Berkley Tie Dye Green</b>
		8-12 oz. fruits are dark pink with green striping, and the flesh is pink with yellow streaks. The flavor is outstanding - sweet and complex like the finest heirlooms. Compact, indeterminate plants,

	<p><b>Black Krim</b></p> <p>This rare, and outstanding tomato yields 3-4" slightly flattened dark-red (mahogany-colored) slightly maroon, beefsteak tomatoes with deep green shoulders. Green gel around seeds. Fantastic, intense, slightly salty taste (which is great for those not wanting to add salt to their tomatoes). Suitable for container/patio garden. Perfect choice for slicing, salads and cooking.</p>
	<p><b>Striped German</b></p> <p>Large 12 to 16 ounce fruits - Fruit are slightly ribbed with yellow and red marbling, inside and out. A delicious beauty when sliced and also makes a great canning tomato. Meaty fruits have a complex tropical flavor and an excellent smooth texture. Heavy yielder. 80 days Indeterminate</p>
	<p><b>Pink Berkely Tie Dye</b></p> <p>A true flavor experience. Extremely robust flavors; complex and hard to describe: sweet, rich, tart, salty with a hint of smokey and a dripping juicy texture. Fruits are 8-12 oz, round to oblate with green metallic stripes over pink skin. 78 days. Indeterminate</p>
<p><b>Cherry Tomatoes</b></p>	
	<p><b>Wapsipinicon Peach</b></p> <p>A two bite tomato with an unbelievably delicious nectar-like, juicy flavor.. Named for a river in northeastern Iowa this tomato produces a plentiful supply of light yellow fruits with tinges of pink and a touch of fuzzy peach like skin. 78 days. Indeterminate.</p>



		<b>Cucumber--Pickling</b>
		Also known as Ace. Uniformly straight 10" fruits hold their dark-green color for a long time. Very productive and a good choice for pickling, as the name suggests. Excellent variety for home or market gardens. Best picked when 4-6" long. Introduced in 1928 by Abbott & Cobb of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. 50-55 days.

		Flat leaf Parsley
