A Message from our Minister

Dear Members and Friends of UCC,



Just to check my memory I asked my husband if he ever remembers me cooking a turkey at home on Thanksgiving. He was silent for a few moments and then said, “No, you have never cooked a turkey, but you don’t like cooking turkeys anyhow,” I responded: “How would I know, if I have never cooked one?” I love to cook and would be happy to cook a turkey with all the fixings. But as an adult I have never spent a Thanksgiving in my own home. For me my memories of Thanksgiving involve arguments about where to go. I long to stay home for my favorite holiday, no presents, no religion, time off from work, reflections on colonization, and words of gratitude. But I am always in someone else’s home. Even as a child there was tension around which side of the family, we would spend Thanksgiving with. Often, we ended up at two gatherings. Turkey and Italian food at noon and then turkey and Greek food in the evening.

When I met my husband, it became more complicated because our respective families lived in different states. Where would we go for thanksgiving? We made deals with our mothers, Thanksgiving with one family, Christmas with the other and switching every year. That seemed to work out for a while. Until my stepdaughter’s family grew to the point where it was too expensive to fly all six of them to New England from the West Coast.

Do I sound like I am complaining? I feel like complaining because I long to stay home for Thanksgiving. But then I think of all the people in my life who have nowhere to go for Thanksgiving, many of my friends, and perhaps some of you reading this. While my memories of this day are overwhelmed by all the people in my life who want my little family to be with them, my heart breaks open with a river of tears for all the people who have no family, no invitation, nowhere to go, no one to be with. Then I feel hope and gratitude for this community and how much you care for one another.

For the past few years we were in Plymouth Massachusetts, where my mother lives, and attended the National Day of Mourning for Indians on Coles Hill overlooking Plymouth Rock. The gathering is powerful. Native people fast and pray and enter ceremony as non-native people engage in sacred witness. Native people speak their truth about their history, current issues, and struggles they face. They are working on deconstructing the pilgrim mythology of Thanksgiving.



This year we are going to Northern California to be with our four grandchildren and taking my daughter and my mom. It will be stressful, chaotic, and interesting. I still have hope that someday I will stay home and cook a turkey on Thanksgiving.


Our UU traditional all church **Harvest Dinner is B-A-C-K!!**





BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

At the November 10 meeting, the Board

- Voted to hire Leah Boyd of Clarity services to lead a skill session on Non-Violent Communication
- Heard from Susan Burnett, Chair of the Congregational Security Committee about options to evaluate our campus safety.
- Agreed that the Restorative Justice Committee will review nominations for a Congregational Covenant Writing Team. June Zellers will assemble a group to present a draft by year's end.
- One group from the Sharing Cafes suggested reaching out to the neighbors around UCC and inviting them to join us in community.
- Acknowledged positive feedback on changes in our Covid 19 policies.
- Changed Monique Bergere's duties to include membership and Fellowship Hour responsibilities.
- Agreed that Board members will serve as greeters.
- Rev. Christina invited all staff and other church leaders to a Leadership Council on Nov. 20 after the service to 'affirm our commonalities.
- Voted to subscribe to PowerMarket Maine's solar farm project in Bristol.
- Approved the Clerk's report and received reports from the Treasurer, the Finance Committee Chair, the President's report and the Minister's report.
