#### First Parish Kingston, MA vandalism update from First Parish's Faithify Campaign:

#### About this campaign:

In the early morning hours of July 4, 2024, an individual broke through the windows of our historic meetinghouse and spent the next few hours causing **tens of thousands of dollars in damages** to the exterior and interior of our building. He shattered windows, tore off wooden shutters, broke window framing, and sprayed fire extinguisher foam everywhere. Perhaps the worst act of all was lighting our Progress Pride and Black Lives Matter flags on fire while they still hung on the front of our building. This attack was violent and sustained.

The suspect has been apprehended by the Kingston Police Department and is now in custody awaiting arraignment. We are grateful for their hard work to protect our church from further damage. And now we must turn to efforts of cleanup and restoration.

First Parish Kingston was founded in 1717, pre-dating the founding of the Town of Kingston by 9 years. Our current Meetinghouse was built in 1851 and we have taken great pains over the year to maintain and beautify this historic structure, including extensive interior renovation in 2021 and a planned roof replacement for this summer.

We are grateful to so many friends, neighbors, fellow churches and others who have offered to help us. We ask you to support our mission of being an inclusive faith community, grounded in love and equity, where everyone can feel belonging and where we all do the work of justice together.

Thank you for whatever you are able to offer, and please share widely with others that might want to help too. In faith,



All the Walks combine an actual walking tour retracing some historical / colonial event combined with a program with guest speakers and some have an art element - so even folks who cannot do the walking have plenty of opportunity to participate by listening and learning.

### **Update From the Maine Gun Safety Coalition**

We expect a vote **this week** on the bill referred to as the "Engaged In The Business Rule." Please reach out to Susan Collins **today** to ask her to support the ATF's rule and oppose the gun lobby's efforts? This message will also go to the other members of the Maine delegation, but Senator Collins's vote is crucial to our success. We need your help to protect this rule and make sure that everyone who buys a gun is legally allowed to do so. **Please click here to email them now.** 

This rule is a new ATF regulation that stems from the Bipartisan Safer Communities Act, passed into law in 2022. It helps to close dangerous loopholes in gun safety regulations by clearly defining who is required to register as a federal firearms dealer, and in turn, perform background checks on any customers before selling them guns. Before this, many gun vendors were able to avoid becoming licensed dealers by only operating at gun shows or online and therefore did not have to perform any background checks, regardless of who they were selling to.

The NRA and other anti-gun safety advocates are trying to weaken or eliminate the rule in the legislature, which would result in guns continuing to be distributed across the country to individuals that cannot pass a background check. Please use this link to demand that our elected representatives oppose S.J. Res. 83 and H.J. Res. 144.
